## Brown Opinion Project: March 2025 Poll Results



#### Methodology

The Brown Opinion Project (BOP) conducted its March 2025 poll on March 4, March 6, and March 7. BOP solicited responses from Brown undergraduate students near Faunce Hall and Sciences Park. BOP representatives asked every person who passed their location if they were interested in taking a quick anonymous poll. Responses were anonymously collected using Google Forms. Over the course of the polling process, BOP collected 617 total responses from Brown undergraduate students.

### **Self-Reported Demographic Information**

The sample of undergraduate students who took the poll is demographically similar to the Brown undergraduate student population on campus. The sample was 34% first-years, 25.6% sophomores, 17.3% juniors, and 23% seniors. The sample was 41.5% female, 56.7% male, 3.9% non-binary or genderqueer, 1.3% questioning, unsure, other, or prefer not to answer. Additionally, 50.4% of respondents identified as white, 40.4% as Asian, 9.6% as Black, 9.9% as Hispanic, 3.7% as Middle Eastern or North African, 0.8% Native American or Alaska Native, 0.3% Native Haiwaiian or Pacific Islander while 0.8% preferred not to answer. The percentages for race add up to more than 100 percent because some respondents selected more than one race/ethnicity. 27.9% of students identify as LGBTQ+, 66.9% of students do not identify as LGBTQ+, and 5.2% of students were unsure or preferred not to answer. Students also indicated their (intended) field of study: 45.7% of respondents identified as Physical Science concentrators, 32.1% of respondents identified as Social Science concentrators, 27.2% of respondents identified as Arts and Humanities concentrators, 23.0% of respondents identified as Life Science concentrators, and 1.5% of respondents selected prefer not to answer. The percentages for fields of study add up to more than 100 percent because some respondents selected more than one.
